Payroll Giving



You can make a difference to local people in our care by regularly donating through Payroll Giving (also known as Give as you Earn or Workplace Giving).

What is Payroll Giving?

Payroll Giving is an easy and convenient way for employees to donate money to charity. It provides a flexible and tax efficient way of donating money to St Helena directly from your salary.

How does Payroll Giving work?

Choose the amount you wish to donate and each payday it will be deducted automatically through your salary. The tax on that donation will be given by the government, which means St Helena Hospice receive more money at no extra cost to you!

For example:

Pledge to St Helena Hospice	Cost to you as taxpayer (20%)	Cost to you as taxpayer (40%)	St Helena Hospice receive
£5	£4	£3	£5
£10	£8	£6	£10

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What your gift could fund

- £5 a month / £60 a year could provide vital care and support for patients at the end of their life from a nurse at the Hospice for over two hours.
- £10 a month / £120 a year could provide pain management and symptom relief for a patient, along with emotional support and advice for their family, with a three hour visit from a rapid response clinical nurse specialist.
- £15 a month / £180 a year could help someone struggling with the death of a loved to be supported through five sessions of one-to-one bereavement counselling.
- £20 a month / £240 a year could provide pain management and relief from complex symptoms for six hours with help from a hospice doctor.
- £30 a month / £360 a year could provide compassionate care and support to a patient in their last days of life from a clinical support worker for more than 24 hours.
- £50 a month / £600 a year could pay to run our rehabilitation service for more than 24 hours, helping patients to maintain their independence for as long as possible and achieve their goals.
